Level up your summer BBQ: recycling food scraps for a greener grill

his season, take your summer food activities to the next level by recycling food scraps in your organics cart provided by Republic Services. It's an easy way to make your BBQs guilt-free and environmentally friendly.

Instead of tossing those watermelon rinds, corn husks and veggie trimmings into the trash, toss all food scraps into your organics cart along with your landscape trimmings. By doing so, you're diverting organic waste from landfills and giving it a new life through composting. Why does it matter? When food scraps decompose in landfills, they release harmful greenhouse gases like methane into the atmosphere. Composting, on the other hand, helps reduce these emissions and provides nutrient rich soil for our community.

To keep things fresh, here are some tips you can follow:

- Layer yard trimmings in your organics cart before disposing of food scraps
- Use a paper bag to collect and dispose of food scraps
- S Freeze or refrigerate food scraps until your service day
- Empty your kitchen food scraps container regularly into the organics cart
- Sprinkle your organics cart with baking soda

Keep our streets clean!

elp keep our streets clean and free of debris! Please do not rake, wash, or blow leaves or trash into the street. Place trash into the appropriate container for proper disposal. Sweepers are not able to pick up large piles of leaves or trash as it clogs the vacuum tubes of the machine. Please move or park your vehicle in your driveway on street sweeping day. Placement of Containers for Collection

Republic Services passes through neighborhoods between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. each day collecting waste. To ensure your trash, recycling and organic waste is collected, we recommend placing your containers out as early as 4 p.m. the day prior to collection and no later than 7 a.m. of the day of collection. This will help reduce the chance of a missed pickup. However, if Republic Services misses any containers, please call **(714) 238-2444** to report the missed pickup and schedule the collection. Thank you for doing your part to help keep Anaheim clean!

Construction & Demolition recycling requirements

The state requires all Construction and Demolition projects to recycle or salvage for reuse a minimum of 65 percent of the nonhazardous waste.

Republic Services can provide construction and demolition waste bins in a variety of sizes, which will meet the state's recycling compliance.

Help reduce the risk of truck fires

Batteries and other ignitable materials can start fires inside curbside carts, collection trucks and waste facilities.

Lithium-ion batteries, which are found in many rechargeable devices, like cell phones, laptops and headphones, are the most common cause of fires. These items should not be thrown away in the trash.

Instead, recycle batteries at the county's Household Hazardous Waste Collection Center at 1071 N. Blue Gum St. or find a local retail center near you at Call2Recycle.org.

Lithium-ion batteries can easily ignite when damaged, and in the process of collecting and processing curbside trash, they are likely to be mangled. Mechanized trucks typically crush waste when picking it up. At material recovery facilities, items travel across conveyors and tumble through a series of sorting machines. At landfills, waste is compacted by heavy equipment. The fires sparked by lithium-ion batteries not only cause damage to vehicles or facilities, but can also result in injuries and service disruptions in the community.

In addition to posing fire hazards, when we trash our portable devices and their batteries, we cannot reuse the beneficial and often rare materials they contain in new products.

We can all do our part to ensure we properly dispose of these batteries to keep our community safe.

Allow hot ashes and charcoal to burn out completely and cool for at least 48 hours before disposing of them. Wrap the ashes in heavy-duty aluminum foil and place into your trash container.

His favorite food to grow? Simply anything that grows plentifully, such as bell peppers and chilies.


If you'd like to start composting at home, you can purchase a bin from Anaheim Public Works by calling (714) 765-6883.

Used Oil Collection Centers: The City of Anaheim has 31 certified used oil collection centers that will accept your used motor oil and filters for FREE recycling. Call (714) 765-4154 for a location near you.

DIY Oil Change Kit: Anaheim Fire & Rescue has an oil change kit that will help you get started with your DIY car project. Each DIY oil change kit includes a 15 quart used oil container, five shop rags and a used oil recycling information card.

No fats, oils or grease down the drain!

FOG is the acronym for Fats, cooking **O**ils and **G**rease. If FOG goes down the drain and into sewers, it congeals, coating the inside of pipes and leading to blockages and sewer backups.

Follow these easy steps to properly dispose of FOG:

- **Over** Put fats, oils or grease down the drain.

S Dispose of FOG by mixing small quantities of FOG with absorbent

materials, such as paper towels, kitty litter, coffee grounds or shredded paper. Then bag it in a plastic bag and put it into your trash cart or dumpster. With larger quantities, such as liquid cooking oil from a turkey fryer, place it into a sealed container (5 gallons or less in size) and deliver it to one of Orange County's Household Hazardous Waste Collection Centers. These centers will accept a maximum of 15 gallons of cooking oil per resident per visit.
