

Business Startup Checklist

Once you decide to go into business...

- □ Visit or call the City of Anaheim Planning Department (714.765.5139)
 - Identify the zone(s) where your business can operate
 - Discuss the development standards that apply to your business (parking, sign regulations, operational standards)
 - o Find out about the various business programs the City offers
 - Use our online <u>Property Info</u> application for assistance in finding potential locations or compiling market research/ demographic information

Find a Suitable Location

- <u>Before you sign a lease or purchase a property</u>, talk with City staff or submit an <u>Anaheim</u> <u>Anytime Request</u> to ensure your business is compatible with the property's zoning
- If you plan to make tenant improvements, renovations, or install equipment, call the Building Division to determine if you need to submit plans and/or obtain building permits (714-765-5153)

□ Register your business name and/or complete the legal structure

- If using a Fictitious Business Name or DBA (doing business as), you will need to register with the County Clerk's Office – (714) 834-2889 // <u>www.oc.ca.gov</u>
- If you are considering becoming a corporation (stock or nonprofit), a limited liability company or a partnership (limited or limited liability), you must file with the Secretary of State's Office (916) 657-5448 // www.sos.ca.gov

□ Apply for any required permits and licenses

- For a complete list of permits required for your business, go to the State of California's Economic Development Website - <u>http://www.calgold.ca.gov</u>
 - If your business is selling or leasing tangible property, you will need a Sellers Permit from the State Board of Equalization – (800) 400-7115 // www.boe.ca.gov
 - If your business intends to prepare and/or sell food of any type, you will need a Health Permit from the Orange County Health Care Agency – (714) 433-6000 // <u>http://ochealthinfo.com/</u>
 - If your business will sell or serve alcoholic beverages, you will need a license from the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board – (714) 558-4101 // <u>www.abc.ca.gov</u>. You may also need a Conditional Use Permit from the Planning Commission – (714) 765-5139 // <u>www.anaheim.net/planning</u>

□ Apply for a City of Anaheim Business License

- Complete a Business License application <u>http://www.anaheim.net/planning</u> > Click on Business License (left side)
- If you are a home based business, you will also need to register for a <u>home occupation permit</u> from the Planning Department (714) 765-5139 // <u>www.anaheim.net/planning</u>. Please note that there are restrictions on the types of businesses that can be conducted from homes.

□ Contact the Franchise Tax Board

 Only required if you will have employees or if you need to obtain a Form 540 for estimating State Withholding Tax – (800) 852-5711 // <u>www.ftb.ca.gov</u>

Contact your Insurance Agent

• For information regarding what type of insurance your business will require, including workers' compensation and liability insurance
