What is a Specific Plan?

The Beach Boulevard Specific Plan will:

- Be a long-term plan to guide new investment, new development, and new improvements
- Recommend changes to Beach Boulevard and other streets
- Establish new zoning regulating uses, heights, setbacks, open space requirements and parking
- Prioritize capital improvement projects
- Provide new design guidelines to ensure quality architecture and landscaping
- Include funding and financing strategies for public improvements
- Streamline the approval process for new development
